Climate change helps puts Greenland at center of power fight, UTA professor says: Assistant Professor of Earth and Environmental Sciences Nathan Brown served as the sole contributor to this [Fort Worth Star-Telegram](#) article that explains recent U.S. interest in Greenland, part of which deals with the island's natural resources. "Yes, there are a lot of rich ore bodies in southern Greenland. But is it straightforward to extract them? From a natural science perspective, not at all," Dr. Brown said.
