Dallasites can catch two lunar eclipses in 2026. Here's when and how to see them: [The Dallas Morning News](#) tapped UTA Planetarium Director Levent Gurdemir to discuss two lunar eclipses this year that will be visible to North Texans—a total eclipse before dawn in March and a partial eclipse late in August. Unlike solar eclipses, lunar eclipses are safe to view without special glasses. "The tools to watch an eclipse most people are already equipped with," Gurdemir said, "which are a set of eyes."
