

As a part of a new IRB Mentoring Initiative, CRTLE and the Office of Regulatory Services (ORS), are looking for two IRB Mentor Fellows.

This fellowship enhances faculty development in mentoring by supporting students conducting human subject research, helping them navigate IRB requirements and prepare high-quality protocol submissions.

Fellowship Details:

- **Duration:** 1 semester (Fall or Spring), renewable
- **Commitment:** 3 – 4 hours per week
- **Stipend:** \$2,500 (paid at semester end)
- **Application Deadline:** **January 15, 2026**

Call for Proposals: UT System OER Grant Program

The UT System Office of Academic Affairs is inviting proposals for the **Curricular Innovation through OER Grant Program**, a two-year initiative supporting the use of Open Educational Resources to enhance teaching, curriculum design, and student success. A total of **\$250,000** in funding will be awarded across individual and collaborative projects systemwide.

Each institution may submit up to four proposals, with local review led by library and academic leadership before final selection by UT System. Details about UTA's internal review process will be shared soon. UTA proposals will be due **Friday, January 16**.

Focus on Dr. Dereje Agonafer

The Faculty Spotlight series showcases excellence in faculty teaching and mentoring.

CRTLE highlights exemplary mentorship at UT Arlington. Dr. Agonafer, a Presidential Distinguished Professor and National Academy of Engineering member, has graduated 259 graduate students (including 42 PhDs) since 1999 and currently advises a large, active cohort. His mentorship combines rigorous, hands-on research, direct industry collaborations, strong professional networking, and a lab culture built on trust, real-world responsibility, and long-term support.



Many of his mentees go on to work at top-tier companies, a testament to his commitment to preparing “career-ready” engineers. If you’re interested in meaningful faculty-student mentoring, this profile is well worth a read.

Teaching AI Literacy in the Age of Scams:

A Conversation with Dr. Gabriel Aguilar

This is a timely and important read. Aguilar, an assistant professor of technical writing, draws on his personal experience being scammed as a student to show how modern fraudsters leverage AI-tools (voice cloning, deep-fake audio, etc.) to trick vulnerable individuals. His work argues that teaching students “AI literacy,” particularly through technical and professional communication courses, can equip them to detect deceptive AI tactics and help protect not only themselves but also their families and communities. The post also outlines a practical, four-part framework for instructors who want to incorporate AI-scam awareness into their teaching. Check it out, especially if you’re interested in how we might integrate critical AI-literacy and digital responsibility into our courses.
