




STUDENT SUCCESS



01 — Annual Graduate Student Conference

This year's conference covered a variety of topics on **effective teaching** and **faculty job search strategies** with GTA and faculty panel sessions. Graduate students had opportunities to interact with peers, **build community**, and learn more about CRTLE's new College Teaching Training Certificate (CTTC) program launched in the Fall 2021 semester.

02 — Faculty Lounge

The CRTLE Faculty Lounge, led by Faculty Facilitators featured unique topics, workshops, informal conversation, and exchange of great teaching ideas. Topics included strategies for teaching with groups/teams, making and using effective **assessments**, promoting **inquiry-based teaching**, engaging students, implementing technology, and **class interaction**/management in all modalities.



03 — Peer Observation Training with Certificate

CRTLE hosted training sessions on conducting and completing the proper documentation for the **official Peer Observation of Teaching** requirement of the **UT System**. Faculty learned observation skills and techniques for providing useful and meaningful feedback to colleagues and ways to promote their **teaching effectiveness**. A certificate of completion was provided to attendees to indicate preparation as a Certified Peer Observer.

RESEARCH AND INNOVATION



01 — Microsoft Teams for Teaching 50/50 Hybrid

CRTLE hosted two comprehensive sessions co-sponsored by the Office of Information Technology (**OIT**) and Education Technology Support Services (**ETSS**) on how to use **Teams for Teaching for all modalities** in UTA classrooms. The sessions included information on new functionalities of Microsoft Teams, as well as using **Echo 360** and document cameras in conjunction with Teams.





FINANCE AND INFRASTRUCTURE



01 — CRTLE Classroom [Trinity Hall 105]

The CRTLE Classroom, located in room 105 Trinity Hall was designed and opened in this new building in spring 2021 with the vision and purpose of being **dedicated to faculty and GTA** professional development, training, and collaborative opportunities focused on **promoting excellence in teaching**. The CRTLE Classroom is fitted with high-end, state-of-the-art interactive technology, funded through a **Department of Education grant** to provide an effective face-to-face, hybrid, and hyflex demonstration classroom for modeling innovative teaching practices. With movable tables, an interactive white board, cameras, Echo 360, built-in ceiling microphones, and more, it is a comfortable, **welcoming space for faculty and GTAs** to gather, plan, network, mentor one-another, and gain meaningful teaching experiences to bring to their students.

01 — Community Partner Breakfast and Volunteer Opportunity Event


