2:33 P.M. Provost Aswath:

• Yesterday was the last day of classes. We only have a dead day, not a dead week.

- Commencement will be May 12th-14th.
- Graduation rate increased by 51% last year and projecting up to 56% this year, which is a significant jump with all of the work from the Division of Student Success.
- Blaze Forward will impact 4K students this fall (for students who's families make under (\$85K). The funding sources are UTA funds, federal funds and UT System.
- Kay Johnson-Winters: It appears that we lost a week in our course schedule. It seems to affect dead week.

Provost Aswath: We don't have a dead week anymore, it's a dead day, because we don't have the time, because summer schedule, and May-mester coming up.

Faculty Senator: Question on the behalf of faculty that there is concern about the shared services. We are not replacing admins who are leaving.

Provost Aswath: I know that this is a local issue within COLA. Doesn't want to interject into this. This is an issue being managed by the Dean of the College. I am supportive of your needs. The provost's office don't have any influence over this. Please ask them the right questions about the services that you need.

We are recruiting for ACUE now. There are two sessions per year with 25 modules per course. Only certification in Higher Education in the U.S. program.

Also recruiting in the Fall for the Leadership Academy.

2:48 P.M. Jason Shelton: 2021 Campus Climate Survey. This was conducted under President Karbhari and Jean Hood. The survey focused on recruitment and retention of URM faculty and staff. The task force worked on this for 6 months, but the results were never completed for many reasons. President Lim authorized the survey for COACHE. Then others asked about the campus survey, which is what is being shared today.

Main Findings:

65% White 15% Black 11% LatinX 11% Asian

1% Arabic 1% Native American

The results don't account for Arabic and Native Americans, because the numbers are too low.

Sample size: 709 participants completed the entire survey.

Survey Question: I feel comfortable working at UTA;

86% of the people feel comfortable working at UTA; 8% disagree.

Survey Question: I have to work harder than Colleagues/co-workers to get the same recognition:

47% disagree and 30% agree, 23% don't feel either way.

For African-Americans and Asians show a pattern by race are sharply differing from whites and feel that they must work harder.

Survey Question: Racism at UTA may be a problem of the past and not today.

50% disagree, 30% agree.

African-Americans and Whites sharply differ on this issue.

Survey Question: UTA places too much emphasis on diversity.

63% disagree

Only 16% of the people feel UTA places too much emphasis on diversity.

African Americans and LatinX disagree sharply with white colleague/co-worker counterparts.

Summary of the results:

Vast majority (86%) feel comfortable. While many respondents believe that they must work harder for the same recognition, most do not (47%). Nearly half feel that racism is still a problem at UTA. 63% of respondents do not believe that UTA puts too much emphasis on diversity.

Provost and Senior VP for Academic Affairs and VP for Research and Innovation. The candidates for these positions will be on campus next week.

- The faculty senate will represent in campus visits for these two positions.
- TimeKeeper took our advice seriously.

Kaushik De: They plan to keep up with the items that we have discussed.

Dark Matter Event was successful and nice.

TCOFS: Critical Race Theory Presentation. Update from Texas Association for College Teachers (Lobbying organization that people can join and pay membership). Since we are not able to lobby ourselves. Jackie has information about TACT and what it is. Had presentations from AAUP. Jackie was elected the co-VP of the Northeast Texas Region of Faculty Senate. It involves interaction with other Texas HigherEd institutions in and outside of UT System institutions.

Had a meeting with EVC Archie Holmes.

Talked about UNT System tuition. Issue, out of state tuition should be at the same rate of undocumented students. This is something for us to watch.

Talk about legislature concerning tenure and promotion.

Parental Leave: useful update from UT System HR representative. Legislative Bill, for when you retire you can donate your sick leave to a pool. It can help people who don't have enough to take a break from when they need it. There is a detrimental tax implication on those who donate, but this needs clarification from HR. But there are tax implications from donor. This affects people who want to donate can cause them not to do so. Jackie will follow up with HR.

Election Results:

Kathryn Warren: New faculty senate secretary. First NTT executive committee member and secretary.

Andrew Milson: Faculty Senate Chair elect.

COACHE (Bill Carroll): Coach is very different from Jason Shelton's survey because COACH is just faculty. Jason Shelton's survey is faculty and staff. Will look at the results and see if any of the informational data is usable with COACHE.

Faculty Senator: Should ask faculty if they are OK with their workload policy.

Bill Carroll: Your committee could do this. Also this isn't on the list of themes for COACHE.

Committee Reports:

OPC: HOP on senate appointment.

Apportionment: Every department gets 1 faculty senator if the faculty members is at 23.

60 senators shall be reappointed. Proposed revision of reapportionment for a better balance and committees can do work well. Goal was just to discuss it so that the senators can think about it.

Special Projects Committee (Taner): Emeritus Nominations were shared with the chair. Hopefully will get great names.

Toni Sol: Toni will give the dossiers to the new president. She will make the decision.

Venkat: Workload policies: This is just a snap shot in time.

Guidelines: Started with UT System document put out in 2017. Collected policies from the department and colleges to put them in a file. Committee is collecting data and will come up with conclusions.
