Midterm Project

Student <u>groups</u> recreate a piece of medieval technology based on primary sources.

Students are required to share information & help other groups.








#### COMPETITION: Final Project

The same student groups, now <u>teams</u>, build medieval catapults to compete: whose "siege engine" is the most powerful?

Sharing information beyond the team is discouraged.
