During bi-weekly PLC meetings, we discussed all the opportunities available to both use, modify, and create open access resources.


This sparked many ideas for consideration – everything from Open Access journals to textbooks to assignments, and activities.


All Things Open Resulted in Numerous Opportunities

1) OER CARES Grant secured to develop an engaging and interactive Public Relations Workbook for my PR Campaigns class. This workbook will help guide students through the campaign planning process (\$74 savings per student).



- 2) Submitting a Faculty Teaching in the Archives grant for my graduate-level Crisis Communication course in fall 2024. Students will engage with special collections to analyze historical campus events and activities through a crisis communication lens and consider any modern-day implications.
- 3) Submitting a Teaching and Learning Open Initiatives Grant to develop an in-class activity that allows students to experience what it's like to manage communication during a crisis in real-time as events unfold.
