The minor in Glass allows students the opportunity to explore the sculptural, conceptual and functional aesthetics of glass as an artistic media. A variety of traditional, contemporary and experimental glass working techniques are examined and utilized in the challenging course of work. Our program is fine art based; the tools that are learned are applicable to a range of practices. After completing four required courses, student can choose from a range of upper level classes depending on individual goals.

The student's major department must approve any minor; students should consult an Art & Art History Department advisor/faculty advisor to determine the selection of courses.
