**Professor Beatrice Ann Wright Disability Studies Endowed Scholarships are available for students who have declared a minor in Disability Studies and who meet the following criteria:**

- 1) Have completed a minimum of 6 hours (including currently enrolled classes) towards the Disability Studies Minor with an average of “B” or better.
- 2) Who will be completing the required DS 4395 internship course in the current semester or the one immediately following. (Note: applicants who are applying a semester in advance should check with the Disability Studies Minor office to confirm their eligibility).
- 3) Scholarly excellence.
- 4) Who have completed the application, including supplemental questions below.

**\*\*please inquire with the Disability Studies Minor office if you have unusual circumstances.**

**Award:** \$250-\$500 (funds will be awarded during the internship semester)

**Deadline:** November 15

### **Supplemental Questions**

1. In a typed statement of up to 500 words, describe how declaring a Disability Studies minor and your education in DS courses fit into and have influenced your academic or professional goals for the future.
2. At which approved DS internship site do you hope to intern and in which semester?
3. In a typed paragraph, explain how you will use the scholarship to support completing your required Disability Studies internship. (Potential uses include, but are not limited to defraying tuition or time off from paid work; covering the costs of transportation to/from an internship, paying for assistive technology for internship work, or paying a caregiver, among others)
4. Unofficial UTA transcript, which can be downloaded for free from MyMav.
