Beginning the Journey

- Familiarize yourself with the Suggested Course Sequence and other items on the Student Resources page on the Music Department website.
- Focus on your core music courses, such as Private Lessons and Studio, Ensembles, Theory, Sight Singing and Ear Training, Functional Piano, and Methods classes.
- Meet with your advisor to make sure you are on track to begin pre-professional courses.

Trailblazing the Path

- Work toward completing your Music Core and Academic Core classes and moving into classes specific to your major.
- Meet with your Area Coordinator to discuss Internship options.
- Meet with your advisor to declare your major.

- Enhance your music education experience by attending master classes, student and staff recitals, ensemble performances, and musical theater productions.
- Investigate one of the many Music Department honor societies and explore requirements for joining.
- Participate in various fundraising and outreach activities sponsored by music honor societies, even prior to joining
- Join one of the music honor societies and fully participate in their activities and projects.
- Speak with your area coordinators about additional career related service opportunities.
- Contact the Center for Service Learning for volunteer opportunities.

- Apply to work for, and with, the Music Department event staff to gain an understanding of the behind-the-scenes work of providing music events.
- Seek out opportunities to provide music tutoring and private lessons in area schools. These are often posted in the music lobby hallway.
- Seek out opportunities to participate in community ensembles. These are often posted in the music lobby hallway.
- Take on a leadership role in one of the music honor societies.
- Enroll in an advanced theory class, or take elective lessons once required lessons are completed.
- Audition for a community-based scholarship.
