Admission Requirements

Applicants to the MS Health Care Administration program are evaluated according to the following index.

(Undergraduate GPA x 200) + GMAT \geq 1050

Applicants who do not meet the above criteria may be eligible for admission based on the totality of their application file. Additional admission criteria include the following:

- GMAT or GRE sub scores (verbal and quantitative)
- GMAT or GRE writing sample
- Grades in specific undergraduate business and non-business courses (math, accounting, economics, statistics, for example)
- Educational objectives and quality of written expression of the application essay
- Letters of recommendation from three persons familiar with the applicant's academic background and/or work experience
- Undergraduate major
- General and specific program accreditation status of degree granting institution
- Professional work experience
- Professional certification or licensure
- A personal interview, at the discretion of the program advisor
