The Comprehensive Assessment and Preparation Program is an evidence-based approach to NCLEX preparation. This procedure details a required comprehensive and consistent implementation plan for coursesin the Undergraduate Pre-Licensure Nursing Program. The CAPP consists of Course Content Mastery Assessments (in courses listed below), Comprehensive Capstone Assessment, and individualized Focused Review based on assessment results. CAPP will be integrated into the following courses:

- N3632: CLINICAL NURSING FOUNDATIONS
- N3381: PSYCHIATRIC MENTAL HEALTH NURSING OF INDIVIDUALS, FAMILIES, AND GROUPS
- N4331: NURSING OF CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS
- N4341: NURSING OF THE CHILDBEARING FAMILY
- N3661: NURSING OF ADULTS
- N4581: NURSING OF ADULTS WITH COMPLEX NEEDS
- N4462: COMMUNITY HEALTH NURSING
- N4351: NURSING LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT
- N4350: CAPSTONE (Comprehensive Assessment)

After each proctored assessment, students are categorized into one of four proficiency levels:

- LEVEL <1: Scores in the <1 category do not meet minimum expectations for performance in this content area.
- **LEVEL 1:** Scores meeting the Proficiency Level 1 standard meet the absolute minimum performance expectations in this content area.
- **LEVEL 2**: Scores meeting the Proficiency Level 2 standard exceed minimum expectations for performance in this content area.
- **LEVEL 3**: Scores meeting the Proficiency Level 3 standard exceed most expectations for performance in this content area.

### **Exam Procedures:**

- 1. ATI assessments are time-limited based on allowing 1 minute for classic NCLEX style Questions and 2 minutes for the Next Generation NCLEX clinical judgment items. For information about ATI Testing Time for each assessment, please refer to the ATI website
- 2. Students must start the proctored assessment (Phase II) on time. Students who start greater than 30 minutes late without faculty approval will be subject to a 20% penalty of the total possible Phase II Proficiency level points.

## **CAPP Course Content Mastery Assessment**

In each course, the Content Mastery Assessment will count for a total of **10%** of the students' course grade and will not be calculated in the weighted exam average. The following grading criteria will be used:

# Phase 1: Practice Assessment and Critical Points

40 points – 4% of course grade

- 1. Complete Practice Assessment
- 2. Complete an active learning template for the five (5) lowest topics.

## Phase 2: Proctored Assessment

Maximum 60 points- 6% of course grade (score based on Proficiency Level achieved and remediation activities)

- 1. Complete Proctored Assessment
- 2. Complete required remediation: Students who do not complete the required remediation by the assigned deadline will receive a failing grade in the course, regardless of course grade and will not progress to their next clinical course
