The University of Texas at Arlington (UTA) College of Nursing & Health Innovation (CONHI) is committed to maintaining a safe, healthy, and productive learning environment for students, faculty, staff, clients, and visitors. In order to provide a safe learning environment, students must be able to perform with reasonable skill in a safe, secure, productive, and effective manner, and remain ableto do so through the entire time they are a student at UTA.

All students are expected to be in good academic standing throughout the program. Good academic standing standards for nursing students include maintaining professional behavior, personal accountability, academic integrity and upholding the <u>Code of Ethics for Nursing Students</u>. Failure to meet these expectations may result in course failure or dismissal from the program. Good academic standing extends beyond the classroom and is an expectation during clinical labs, healthcare facilities and in the community.

In the clinical setting, students must be fit for duty and are expected to perform in asafe manner without signs of impairment. Students exhibiting one or more signs of impairment directly before or during a clinical rotation shift must be addressed immediately. (See Impaired Observation Checklist [IOC]*). Impaired students (including pre-licensure nursing students and registered nurses) are not fit for participating in a Program and may pose significant health and safety risks to themselves and others. Impaired students must be evaluated by a qualified healthcare professional, follow the recommendation for treatment if applicable, receive the recommendation from the healthcare provider to return to the program, and provide documentation they are able to safely return to the program. Specific instructions are provided in the procedure section of this document.

Pre-licensure Nursing Students

All pre-licensure nursing students must complete and pay for a urine drug screen before attending/participating in clinical. Students out of clinical setting for a semester must repeat and pay for the urine drug screen.

The urine drug screen must be **completed within thirty days prior to the start ofclinical** at an approved screening center (<u>UTA Health Services</u> or <u>approved vendors</u>). Results related to the drug screen are confidential and are only disclosed to the Dean (or designee)

and Clinical Compliance nurse. Students with positive results will be required to provide documentation of prescription medication(s).

- Nursing students, who have a positive urine screen, without prescription documentation, will not be allowed to participate in clinical and will need to drop clinical course(s). The student is strongly encouraged to seek evaluation to determine if s/he is safe to be in the clinical setting.
 - At the discretion of the Director of UTA Health Services, students with an initial positive result may be allowed to retest.
- Accepted upper division nursing students with a drug or alcohol related finding on their Group One CBC (Criminal Background Check) are required to petition the BON (Board of Nursing) for a Declaratory Order. These students must receive the BON issued NCLEX-RN® eligibility letter before the programassigned deadline or their acceptance to the program will be withdrawn.
- Any CONHI student who exhibits impaired behavior, based on the IOC, in the clinical setting, will be required to submit a drug screen. The required testis based on the suspected substance and may include blood or urine sample(s).
 - O Student who refuses or does not show up for the screening test for cause/impaired behavior will not be allowed to return to ANY clinical setting and will earn a failing grade.
 - O Student must complete the testing on the day of referral.
 - Student tested for cause cannot return to clinical until results are returned.
 - Student is solely responsibility for substance abuse testing, evaluation, and treatment.
- If positive results are due to alcohol or substance abuse, the student must be evaluated by a qualified healthcare professional, follow the recommendation for treatment if applicable, receive the recommendation from the healthcare provider to return to the program, and provide documentation they are able tosafely return to the program.

Registered Nurses

If a student is a registered nurse and has a positive drug screen, the student will be referred to the state BON where the student is licensed. Student must comply with the BON requirements prior to returning to clinical courses. Failure to complete a BON requirement will result in dismissal from the CONHI. Students who refuse toparticipate in a BON Program will be ineligible to continue at UTA and will be dismissed from the CONHI.

Procedure

When a faculty member or preceptor personally observes or receives reliable information that a student may be impaired, the faculty member or preceptor will assess the student using the Impaired Observation Checklist (IOC) [Checklistprovided below].

If IOC results confirm impairment, the student will be removed immediately from the clinical setting and will be required to submit to the appropriate screening test (blood alcohol level when alcohol is suspected and 13 panel urine scree for other substances).

Student may **not** drive to the testing/screening center. Student may call someone to transport to the testing/screening or use a transportation system, such as taxi, etc.

Depending to the level of impairment, student may be referred to the facilityemergency department for evaluation and care. All screening tests, evaluations, andtreatments costs are the responsibility of the student.

The screening lab must adhere to the following:

- Maintain chain of custody,
- Confirmation GCMS (gas chromatography and mass spectrometry). This iswhere they break down your sample and analyze it chemically to determine what is in there (confirmation of presumptive positive urine specimens)
- Initial screen must include split sampling method
- Blood alcohol level must be drawn, if alcohol involvement is suspected.

If a student exhibits behavior of impairment, based on the Impaired Observation Checklist, and refuses to complete the drug screen, the student will be ineligible toreturn to clinical setting and will fail the course.

Student may not return to the clinical facility until results are received.

- Student with negative screening results may return to the clinical setting.
- Student with positive results must be evaluated by a qualified healthcare professional (psychiatric mental health provider or substance abuseprovider), follow the recommendation for treatment if applicable, receive therecommendation from the healthcare provider to return to the program, and provide documentation they are able to safely return to the program. Upon return to clinical courses, random drug screens will be conducted each semester.

Students must sign an attestation with each clinical course verifying they will adhere to the substance abuse policy. Student cannot sign a consent document, when impaired.

If impairment is suspected the preceptor should contact the faculty immediately. The faculty member, with input from the preceptor, will assess the student using the IOC. Any student suspected of impairment and supported by the IOC will be required to submit a screening test. All expenses, testing, evaluations, and treatments will be the responsibility of the student.

Refusal to Test

In the event that an individual is unable to provide an adequate urine sample (~45 mL) during their initial attempt, their time of arrival will be recorded. The individual will then be required to remain in the testing area and make a subsequent attempt to provide an adequate specimen within three hours. Failure to comply with either of these requirements, including leaving the testing site prior to the completion of the testing process or refusal to cooperate during the testing process, will be considered a refusal to test. It is important to note that a student's refusal to undergo testing will be treated as a positive test result.

If a student leaves the collection facility prior to the testing process being completed, the collector must inform the Clinical Compliance Nurse as required. The Clinical Compliance Nurse will

determine whether the student's actions constitute a refusal to test. To make this determination, the Clinical Compliance Nurse will consider the information documented on the chain of custody and the advice and information received from the collector and service agents, as well as any supporting information provided by the student (i.e., in the event of a medical emergency, copies of hospital admission records/EMS records/police records, etc)
