Students who fail a nursing course, including the nursing preparatory courses, Pharmacology in Nursing Practice and Pathophysiologic Processes: Implications for Nursing, will be placed on academic probation. Students will earn a failing grade for the course and will be placed on academic probation if they:

- score less than 70% on weighted exam or assignment average
- do not meet requirements of the Comprehensive Assessment and Preparation Program
- do not achieve minimum score requirements on Medication Administration Competency Assessment
- have a Clinical Failure

Students on academic probation are required to complete NURS 2232: Professional Nursing and Life Skills course during their next semester of coursework along with the repeated failed course.

As a result of the nursing course failure, students will remain on academic probation for a period of three (3) years. Failure of a second course within the three (3) years of the first failure will result in program dismissal.

Requirements of the course:

- Students must take the course during their next semester of coursework.
- Students who are required to take the course, but do not earn a passing grade, will be required to complete the course again and earn a passing grade. Course failure does not count as the second course failure, leading to program dismissal.

Course recommended for the following students:

- Any student who wishes to improve test taking strategies, time management skills, and clinical skills.
- Students who scored 75% or less in any nursing course are strongly encouraged to enroll in this course.
- Any student who has dropped a nursing course because of potential failure.
