UT Arlington enrollment record driven by robust freshman class: <u>NBC 5</u> and <u>CBS 11</u> reported on UTA's record-setting enrollment, highlighted by a record freshman class of more than 5,100. UTA's preliminary total enrollment for fall 2025 is more than 42,700. "A UTA degree has never been more valued or sought after by students from across Texas and beyond," UTA President Jennifer Cowley said.
