North Texas vaccine experts react to federal advisory council's recommendation: Coordinated by the UTA media relations team, Erin Carlson (College of Nursing and Health Innovation) shared her expertise with the Fort Worth Report on the updated Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's immunization schedule and recommendations. The Denton Record-Chronicle shared this story. Dr. Carlson said changes in how federal government health entities approach vaccines may end up decreasing vaccine usage. "The assumption across the board in public health is this will lead us to a significant decrease in vaccination," she said.
