RESEARCH EXPERIENCE

Priyanjali is passionate about research that improves the lives and well-being of low-income and immigrant populations residing in the United States with a focus on immigrant women's unmet need for reproductive healthcare. Her dissertation uses a community-engaged mixed-methods approach to quantitatively examine differences in pregnancy desires, contraceptive use, and counseling outcomes, and qualitatively discern the role and impact of contraceptive counseling, a health-literacy intervention on family-planning services utilization among low-income immigrant women. Priyanjali enjoys developing and analyzing surveys and qualitative data using tools such as STATA, SPSS, AMOS, Nvivo, and Dedoose. She is also interested in exploring research pathways between reproductive health, intimate partner violence and mental health outcomes.
