

"We're so grateful to the Wolen's Foundation for this amazing gift," Social Work Dean Scott Ryan said. "This allows our students - in a pandemic - to continue their educational studies and field experiences."

Joe Milkes, chief executive officer at the Wolens Foundation, said the organization's donation was aimed partially at helping students, many of whom saw their in-person internships canceled due to social service agency shutdowns amid rising coronavirus infection rates, to complete their internships

More than any other profession, we recognize the importance and strength of diversity and inclusion. We


