

Child Welfare Research Center Scholar Program



The Child Welfare Research Center (CWRC) is opening a call for child welfare scholars. Any currently enrolled student UTA (undergraduate or graduate) is eligible to apply. We will select up to three child welfare scholars per year, and scholars can re-apply in subsequent years. Affiliates will have opportunities to network with child welfare faculty, researchers, and providers, collaborate on projects related to child welfare, have their profiles featured on the CWRC website, and to present at the annual Child Welfare Symposium hosted by the center.

In addition, affiliates are eligible to apply for a professional development award (one awarded per year) that will fund up to \$2,500 of costs to present their work at a conference as an CWRC affiliate.



The MavTHAT ASL Club is coordinating a learning experience for pre-health students and staff across multiple disciplines for Deaf Awareness Month.


